Marion began her lifelong enjoyment of embroidery as a schoolgirl at King Edward Technical School, under the guidance of Miss Moran. She had one grandmother who did some embroidery, was a sewer and made a quilt, but her own mother was not a stitcher.

After leaving school, Marion went to classes at the YWCA, also with Miss Moran, and at the night school where she was taught by Jan Wilson.

Marion joined the guild in the 1980s. She held the offices of both Secretary and Treasurer, and was also the Regional Rep for 6 years. She was Secretary of the Wanaka Embroidery School Committee for 15 years and taught at Wanaka Embroidery School for 16 years. Marion said it would take her 6 months to design and prepare her work for teaching there.







Marion was also involved with taking festival week tours around the churches to explain the embroidery to visitors. She was also a stitcher on several works now displayed about the city including the Dunedin Library and Dunedin Hospital Oncology panels.

Marion likes all embroidery stitches and styles. She particularly likes crewel, stump work and pulled thread. She feels she has mastered them all over the years and there is not one she doesn't enjoy. In regard to UFO's, Marion says she finishes most things but occasionally abandons something she is not inspired by.

Marion stitches daily and attends Thursday group, which she coordinated for many years, and a private group of stitching friends. She is also passed on her stitching love to her daughter Gaynor and an eager grand-daughter is now becoming caught by the "bug".

Marion has willingly shared her knowledge at guild and Thursday group which I am sure we all appreciate and thank her for.
