## PROGRAMME

## SATURDAY 23 September 2017

#### \* **PIN WHEELS** with Betty Twaddle and Pauline Bishop

There are a variety of ways to make these. We can send out prior to the class, the cross stitch and hardanger designs. You can stitch these prior to the class and learn the construction technique on the day, or you can come along and stitch on the day and observe the construction.

Another option is to bring some fabric and you construct this into the pinwheel. Anybody who has not already put their name on the list can contact Betty, and Betty will send the designs out to you.

We will also demonstrate the construction technique we have devised to make a pin ball.

#### **Requirements:**

#### 2" Wheel

8" square of 32 count linen for hardanger design

8" square 28 count even weave for cross stitch design

Embroidery thread

1 metre x 12mm ribbon, to match or contrast with your embroidery/fabric Thread to match your ribbon

#### 3" Wheel

10" square of 32 count linenEmbroidery thread1 metre x 15mm ribbon, to match or contrast with your embroidery/fabricThread to match your ribbon

Usual sewing kit

A kit will be available with cardboard, batting and felt at a cost of \$3.00



### \* SNUTKI POLISH SPIDER WEB EMBROIDERY with Anne Jaquiery



#### Requirements

- Perle Cotton Number 12 Threads Any colour. (Anne will have some threads for practice)
- White stranded cotton
- Hands free frame would be best if you have one or a 7" 8 " frame
- Stiletto, chenille if you have one
- Sewing kit
- Fine pencil
- Small sharp scissors

The piece pictured above is not the piece you will be stitching. It is an example only.


## Of interest...

# SOUP

Throughout our winter meetings the Committee has kindly provided soup for lunch! Several varieties have been offered, all tasting delicious. There have been requests for the Spicey Tomato Soup recipe. This recipe has been kindly sent to us by Shelley Scoular. This is Shelley's adaption of a recipe from Frankie July/Aug 2009

#### **Spicey Tomato Soup**

2 tbsps olive oil
2 onions, roughly chopped
1 small red chilli
1 tsp curry
2 tsps cumin
1 tsp coriander
1/2 tsp cardomon
1/2 tsp turmeric
2 medium apples, peeled and grated
1 can red lentils
4 cans of tomatoes
1 Tbsp red wine vinegar
1 litre of stock



Method: Sauté onions in oil. Add spices and sauté a little longer. Add rest of ingredients and simmer for 35 minutes. Mash or puree with a stick blender. Finish with 1 Tbsp brown sugar and season with salt and pepper
