#### WHAT HAPPENS AT THE MONTHLY GATHERINGS?

Sue has organised a great event for us at Toitu Otago Settlers Museum for our meeting on Saturday 27 April. We will meet at 10 a.m. at Toitu when the museum opens and starting promptly at 10.30 a.m. Claire Orbell will present a talk that she gave at the Costume and Textile Symposium of New Zealand about the Suffrage Panels. There will be the opportunity to view the six suffrage panels and to discuss how the sixth one was made; the original panels were made by Guild members in 1990 and the sixth was done in 2018. You will also have the opportunity to view some of the samplers in the Toitu collection.

Some small motifs taken from existing samplers in the museum's collection have been graphed and will be available for purchase so bring along some fabric of a thread count that you prefer, and threads and your sewing kit. You can enjoy some time stitching at the museum.

You can bring your lunch or enjoy something from the cafe at the museum.

And don't forget to view the Mount Felix Tapestry panels before this exhibition closes on 29th April. You can add a stitch or two to the panels that are currently been worked on.
