MID-WINTER CHRISTMAS MEETING

Our next guild meeting is on Saturday 25 July 2020. This will be our Mid-Winter Christmas meeting and four Christmas decorations will be taught. Soup and bread rolls will be provided for lunch, and morning tea will also be provided.

The 'Show and Tell' table will include embroidery projects finished during lockdown. There will also be a display area for Christmas decorations worked from your stash during lockdown.

We will be donating items for the <u>food bank</u> as well. Please remember to bring something for those in need.

There will be four classes taught on the day. The details and pictures of each project are included below. All prices listed below include the \$5 tutor fee.

Class One - Red Star \$5 (if you bring your own materials) or \$12 (if you order a kit).

Learn an old Italian stitching technique called Punt é nu (or Sardinian Knotted stitch) and make a small Christmas decoration. Notes and pattern supplied.

Requirement List

- 28 count evenweave linen (Permin colour natural or any colour you wish to use) two pieces of 12cm X 12cm or one 12 X 24cm
- No 12 perle thread 1 ball (Colour -red or any colour you wish to use)
- No 26 Tapestry Needles
- Sharp scissors
- Quick Unpick may be useful.

You can choose to bring your own materials (listed above), in which case the class fee is \$5 or purchase a kit to use on the day, in which case the class fee is \$12.

Class Two – Accordion Bauble \$10 (including a kit).

Learn to make an accordion bauble. All materials will be supplied.

Class Three \$5 (all materials provided).

Learn to make this lovely Christmas decoration. The image below is the same decoration, with a different pattern used on each side. Material and thread will be supplied.

OEG EXHIBITION 2020 PRESIDENT'S CHALLENGE

The Power of Poetry

Embroider a line or lines from a published poet and then embroider your interpretation to represent the imagery in the lines. The piece must be titled – An extract from (title of the poem) by (poet). This can be presented in different ways to fit within a 5-inch (13cm) by 8-inch (20cm) radius. It can be much smaller provided it fits within the measurements provided. It could be a plaque, or a needle case, or a small box or a little book. That is entirely your choice.

For example, an extract from 'Hunger' by Laurence Binyon

"I am Hunger"

Embroider examples of physical, mental or spiritual hunger. Or, an extract from 'To Autumn' by John Keats

"Seasons of mist and mellow fruitfulness Close bosom friend of the maturing sun"

Embroider images of autumn literally or figuratively.

Children's poetry, humorous poetry and NZ poetry are wonderful sources of inspiration.
