The Overlord Tapestry tells the story of the World War 2 D-Day landings, known as Operation Overlord. I was lucky enough to visit the tapestry, which is now housed in Southsea, Portsmouth when I visited the United Kingdom about thirty years ago. The first clip is a Movietone News story about the tapestry and the second talks about the women who made it.

Directly after the Second World War, the financial situation in the United Kingdom was not good. Queen Mary (the King's Mother) offered a twelve panelled tapestry carpet that she had worked on during the war to the Prime Minister for the benefit of the nation. It was eventually sold to a Canadian group for public display for over \$100,000 dollars. Here are two articles about it.
